Fire Cider (Mother Earth News)

Traditional recipe known for strengthening the immune system

1/2 c. chopped onion 1/4 c. chopped garlic 1/4 c. grated fresh ginger Cayenne pepper-dried/fresh Apple cider vinegar(ACV)

Honey - to taste

- 1/2 c. grated fresh horseradish 1. In a half gallon jar, mix all but honey. Cover with vinegar 3-4 inches. Seal and set in warm place. Shake daily.
 - 2. After 3-4 weeks, strain and keep liquid. Add warmed honey to taste.
 - 3. Bottle, label, enjoy! Keep in fridge.

Advice from Anita: Allow it to sit for several months. Keep adding ACV as you use it. Fresh, chopped turmeric is a good addition. 1 Tb per day for prevention, 2-3 Tb per day for treatment.

Cover Crops - Winter Garden Helper

A cover crop is ready-to-sow seeds of fast growing plants-often legumes or grasses-planted in late summer or fall into empty or fallow garden beds. Over the winter, these crops do the hard work!

- Examples of cover crops. Winter rye, hairy vetch, red clover, oats, buckwheat, forage rye, field beans, forage pea.
- Benefits. Stop erosion, add valuable organic matter, increase earthworm and micro-organism activity, decrease compaction and improve water and root penetration of the soil.
- How to. Roughly dig the ground over, broadcast your seeds, rake them in to the soil, water them in, cover with straw. Easy!
- Digging in the cover crop. At least a month before sowing or planting, cut crops and leave on the surface as mulch OR Dig the stems and foliage in to the soil.

Putting your Garden to Bed - Winterize Strawberries and Winter Tree Watering Tips

How to Winterize Strawberry Plants so They Come Back Stronger in the Spring

1. Why?

Soil freezes and thaws repeatedly, which can damage plant roots.

2. When?

Best time to winterize is in November or early December, when temps are in the 20s and the top 1 inch of soil is frozen. You'll know it's time when the leaves are floppy and brown.

3. How?

<u>Renovate:</u> Clean up your strawberries. <u>Fertilize:</u> Using a slow-release, balanced granular fertilizer. <u>Mulch:</u> Use hay, pine needles, or weed-free straw. Loosely mound covering your plants with 3-5 inches of mulch materials.



Winter Tree Watering Tips

1. Why?

Trees may be dormant during the winter, but they are not immune to cold, dry conditions. Dry roots during winter and long, dry periods without supplemental water can further damage root systems and kill trees.

2. When?

After the ground freezes, water trees once or twice a month when there isn't snow cover or precipitation. If the area is particularly windy, you might need to water more.



3. How?

Only water when it is warmer than 40 degrees F, and if there is no ice or snow around the tree. Water early in the day and water deeply.

What else?

Mulch: Add a layer of mulch around the base (away from the trunk) - this acts as a blanket!
